## SCHOOL PRODUCTION: TWELVE ANGRY MEN

The School production, Twelve Angry Men, takes place on Tuesday 28 and Wednesday 29 March 2017 at 7:30pm in the Hofmeyr Hall.

Tickets, at a cost of R40.00, go on sale this week and can be purchased after school in the reception foyer. From next week, tickets will be available at break time, as well as after school.

"Twelve Angry Men," by Reginald Rose, is a drama set in the jury room, following a murder trial. The accused is a young man who is on trial for stabbing his father to death. The jury is cloistered to consider his guilt. Should he be found guilty, he will face the death penalty. At the start of the play, all but one of the jurors are convinced that he is guilty. One feels there is some doubt and

forces a discussion of alternative possibilities. As the play unfolds the other jurors eventually begin to find possible flaws in the arguments in favour of a guilty verdict and slowly begin to change their minds.

The dramatic tension is provided through the processes by which each juror comes to change his mind. The themes explored include peer pressure, prejudice against particular groups, former persecution, personal life disappointments and mercy.

The setting remains the same and the action takes place within a few hours.

The original performance was as a television production. There is a famous film version starring Henry Fonda as well.
