U19A

SACS managed to seize the initiative with a lightning-fast counterattack from their own 22-yard line. The goal itself was a masterpiece of teamwork, as Liam Haupt, Ozair Pillai, Litha Kraai, and Ray Bonnet orchestrated a series of precise passes, culminating in Mike Royden Turner calmly finding the back of the net. Their coordination and fluidity were a testament to their skills on the field.

As the game progressed into the second and third quarters, the scoreboard remained unchanged. Mike Cowen, usually a stalwart in defense, sought to contribute offensively from the PC injector position but discovered that scoring proved to be a greater challenge. Meanwhile, Liam Haupt, stationed in midfield, continued to impress with his exceptional ball retrieval and distribution abilities.

Despite their relentless efforts, Langa/Khayelitsha found it difficult to penetrate SACS' defense and failed to register a goal. In the third quarter, they increased their tempo, but their penalty corner opportunities failed to bear fruit.

In the fourth quarter, SACS once again showcased their versatility and adaptability. Stefan Meyer, known for his willingness to play any position required by the coach, extended SACS' lead with an opportunistic backhand goal—an aspect of his game less frequently displayed. The team's final goal came from a Dean Carrick circle entry. Displaying his aerial skills, Carrick delivered a pinpoint pass to an unmarked Ray Bonnet, who calmly slotted the ball into the net.

SACS secured a subdued yet convincing 3-0 victory over Langa/Khayelitsha. The team now sets its sights on the upcoming challenge against Paul Roos, hoping to raise their intensity and maintain their winning momentum.
